<b>B21._</b>	Human Immunodeficiency virus [HIV] disease with malignant neoplasms
<b>C00._ – C97._</b>	Malignant neoplasms <i>Note: Pilocytic/juvenile astrocytoma M-9421 moved from behavior /3 (malignant) to /1 (borderline malignancy) in ICD-O-3. However, SEER registries will CONTINUE to report these cases and code behavior as /3 (malignant).</i>
<b>D00._ – D09._</b>	In-situ neoplasms <i>Note: Carcinoma in situ of the cervix (CIN III-8077/2) and Prostatic Intraepithelial Carcinoma (PIN III-8148/2) are not reportable.</i>
<b>D18.0</b>	Hemangioma, any site <i>Note: Includes Hemangiomas of Brain, Other parts of nervous system and endocrine glands, which are reportable.</i>
<b>D18.1</b>	Lymphangioma, any site <i>Note: Includes Lymphangiomas of Brain, Other parts of nervous system and endocrine glands, which are reportable.</i>
<b>D32._</b>	Benign neoplasm of meninges (cerebral, spinal and unspecified)
<b>D33._</b>	Benign neoplasm of brain and other parts of central nervous system
<b>D35.2</b>	Benign neoplasm of pituitary gland
<b>D35.3</b>	Benign neoplasm of craniopharyngeal duct

**NOTE: Cases with these codes should be screened as registry time allows. These are neoplasm-related secondary conditions for which there should also be a primary diagnosis of a reportable neoplasm. Experience in the SEER registries has shown that using the supplementary list increases casefinding for benign brain and CNS, hematopoietic, and other reportable neoplasms.**

<b>D10._ – D31._, D34, D35.0, D35.1, D35.5 – D35.9, D36._</b>	Benign neoplasms (see “must collect” list for reportable benign neoplasms) <i>Note: Screen for incorrectly coded malignancies or reportable by agreement tumors</i> <i>Note: Borderline cystadenomas M-8442, 8451, 8462, 8472, 8473, of the ovaries moved from behavior /3 (malignant) to /1 (borderline malignancy) in ICD-O-3. SEER registries are not required to collect these cases for diagnoses made 1/1/2001 and after. However, cases diagnosed prior to 1/1/2001 should still be abstracted and reported to SEER.</i>
<b>D37._ – D41._</b>	Neoplasms of uncertain or unknown behavior (see “must collect” list for reportable neoplasms of uncertain or unknown behavior) <i>Note: Screen for incorrectly coded malignancies or reportable by agreement tumors</i>
<b>D44.0 – D44.2, D44.6 – D44.9</b>	Neoplasm of uncertain or unknown behavior of other endocrine glands (see “must collect” list for D44.3-D44.5) <i>Note: Screen for incorrectly coded malignancies or reportable by agreement tumors</i>
<b>D47.0</b>	Histiocytic and mast cell tumors of uncertain behavior
<b>D47.2</b>	Monoclonal gammopathy <i>Note: Screen for incorrectly coded Waldenstrom’s macroglobulinemia</i>
<b>D48._</b>	Neoplasms of uncertain or unknown behavior <i>Note: Screen for incorrectly coded malignancies or reportable by agreement tumors</i>
<b>D60._</b>	Acquired pure red cell aplasia [erythroblastopenia] <i>Note: Screen for anemia disorder related to neoplasm</i>
<b>D61.1 – D61.9</b>	Other aplastic anemias <i>Note: Review for miscodes</i>
<b>D63.0</b>	Anemia in neoplastic disease
<b>D64._</b>	Other anemias <i>Note: Screen for anemia disorder related to neoplasm</i>
<b>D69.4 – D69.9</b>	Other thrombocytopenia <i>Note: Screen for incorrectly coded thrombocytopenia</i>

<b>D72.1</b>	Eosinophilia <i>Note: This is the code for eosinophilia (9964/3). Not every case of eosinophilia is associated with a malignancy. Diagnosis must be "Hypereosonophilic syndrome" to be reportable.</i>
<b>D75.8</b>	Other specified diseases of blood and blood forming organs <i>Note: This is the code for myelofibrosis (NOS) (9961/3). Not every case of myelofibrosis is associated with a malignancy. Review terms included in ICD-O-3 to determine if case is reportable.</i>
<b>D80.3 – D80.5</b>	Selective deficiency of immunoglobulin <i>Note: Associated with lymphoproliferative disorders</i>
<b>D81.0 – D81.2</b>	Severe combined immunodeficiency [SCID] <i>Note: Associated with lymphoproliferative disorders</i>
<b>D84.9</b>	Immunodeficiency, unspecified <i>Note: Associated with lymphoproliferative disorders</i>
<b>D89._</b>	Other disorders involving the immune mechanism, not elsewhere classified <i>Note: Review for miscodes</i>
<b>E13._</b>	Other specified diabetes mellitus <i>Note: Includes diabetes with underlying malignancy</i>
<b>E31.9</b>	Polyglandular dysfunction, unspecified <i>Note: This is the code for "multiple endocrine neoplasia (MEN) type IIA and IIB (rare familial cancer syndrome) "</i>
<b>E88.0</b>	Disorders of plasma-protein metabolism, not elsewhere classified <i>Note: Screen for incorrectly coded Waldenstrom's macroglobulinemia</i>
<b>E88.8</b>	Other specified metabolic disorders <i>Note: Includes Tumor lysis syndrome following antineoplastic drug</i>
<b>G31.8</b>	Other specified degenerative diseases of nervous system <i>Note: Includes myelopathy in neoplastic disease</i>
<b>G52.8</b>	Disorders of other specified cranial nerves <i>Note: Includes myelopathy in neoplastic disease</i>
<b>G54.8</b>	Other nerve root and plexus disorders <i>Note: Includes nerve root and plexus compressions in neoplastic disease</i>

<b>O01._</b>	Hydatidiform mole <i>Note: This is a benign tumor that can become malignant. If malignant, it should be reported as Choriocarcinoma (9100/3) and will have a malignancy code in the C00- C97 range</i>
<b>O99.8</b>	Other specified diseases and conditions complicating pregnancy, childbirth and the puerperium <i>Note: Includes: malignant neoplasm complicating pregnancy, childbirth and the puerperium</i>
<b>Q85.0</b>	Neurofibromatosis (nonmalignant) (9540/1) <i>Note: Neurofibromatosis by itself is not reportable, but it can lead to a reportable condition</i>
<b>Q90._</b>	Down's syndrome <i>Note: Screen for myeloid leukemia associated with Down's Syndrome (9898/3)</i>
<b>R18</b>	Ascites <i>Note: Includes malignant ascites</i>
<b>R52.9</b>	Pain, unspecified <i>Note: Includes neoplasm related pain (acute, chronic); Cancer associated pain; Pain due to malignancy (primary/secondary); Tumor associated pain</i>
<b>R53</b>	Malaise and fatigue

<b>R59._</b>	Enlarged lymph nodes <i>Note: Screen for large B-cell lymphoma arising in HHV8-associated multicentric Castleman disease (9738/3)</i>
<b>R82.8</b>	Abnormal findings on cytological and histological examination of urine
<b>R83.6, R83.7</b>	Abnormal findings on cytological and histological examination of cerebrospinal fluid
<b>R84.6, R84.7</b>	Abnormal findings on cytological and histological examination of respiratory organs and thorax
<b>R85.6, R85.7</b>	Abnormal findings on cytological and histological examination of digestive organs and abdominal cavity
<b>R86.6, R86.7</b>	Abnormal findings on cytological and histological examination of male genital organs
<b>R87.6, R87.7</b>	Abnormal findings on cytological and histological examination of female genital organs
<b>R89.6, R89.7</b>	Abnormal findings on cytological and histological examination of other organs systems and tissues
<b>R91</b>	Abnormal findings on diagnostic imaging of lung
<b>R92</b>	Abnormal findings on diagnostic imaging of breast
<b>Y42.1</b>	Other and unspecified hormone antagonists (poisoning)
<b>Y42.6</b>	Adverse reaction to antigonadotrophins, antiestrogens, antiandrogens, not elsewhere classified
<b>Y43.1 – Y43.4</b>	Adverse effects in therapeutic use, antineoplastic products or drugs
<b>Y43.9</b>	Adverse effects in therapeutic use, primarily systemic agent, unspecified <i>Note: Includes poisoning by primarily systemic and hematological agents</i>
<b>Y44.9</b>	Other and unspecified agents affecting blood constituents <i>Note: Includes bloodstream infection due to central venous catheter</i>
<b>Y63.2</b>	Failure in dosage, overdose of radiation given during therapy <i>Note: Includes adverse reaction to radiation (see also Y84.2)</i>
<b>Y81.2</b>	General and plastic surgery devices associated with adverse incidents-prosthetic and other implants, materials, and accessory devices <i>Note: Includes complications due to breast prosthesis</i>
<b>Y83.0</b>	Surgical operation with transplant of whole organ <i>Note: Includes complications of transplant</i>
<b>Y84.2</b>	Abnormal reaction, radiological procedure and radiotherapy <i>Note: Includes adverse reaction to radiation</i>
<b>Y84.9</b>	Other medical procedures (abnormal reaction) <i>Note: Includes infection due to central venous catheter (see code Y44.9 for bloodstream infection)</i>

The following codes are associated with the paraneoplastic syndrome. Paraneoplastic syndrome by itself is not cancer. It's a disease or symptom that is the consequence of cancer but is not due to the local presence of cancer cells. A paraneoplastic syndrome may be the first sign of cancer. These codes have been removed from the supplemental list and are now in their own list.
